

More of what the Bible teaches on salvation...

We know in our teachings what the Bible says and what is taught throughout the world of Christianity are two entirely different things. Take for example the following verse:

(Psa 50:22) Now consider this, ye that forget God, lest I tear you in pieces, and there be none to deliver. We cannot forget the Bible yet far too often I see people, myself included, that when they were young were into God. As they grow older they feel they can get away with whatever they want as if they somehow "earned" enough "points" to be able to forget God. It doesn't work that way. We are here to wake a lukewarm "Laodocian" church. Right now I am having an argument about not being saved. I know that my future sins are not paid for. If I do sin, which I will I can repent, but I do not have a license to sin. I don't have the right to become a drunkard, a drug addict, or a fornicator and expect to go to heaven.

(Heb 10:26) For if we sin wilfully after that we have received the knowledge of the truth, there remaineth no more sacrifice for sins,

(Heb 10:27) But a certain fearful looking for of judgment and fiery indignation, which shall devour the adversaries.

(Heb 10:28) He that despised Moses' law died without mercy under two or three witnesses:

(Heb 10:29) Of how much sorer punishment, suppose ye, shall he be thought worthy, who hath trodden under foot the Son of God, and hath counted the blood of the covenant, wherewith he was sanctified, an unholy thing, and hath done despite unto the Spirit of grace?

(Heb 10:30) For we know him that hath said, Vengeance belongeth unto me, I will recompense, saith the Lord. And again, The Lord shall judge his people.

(Heb 10:31) It is a fearful thing to fall into the hands of the living God.

Underlining emphasis my own. Furthermore the Bible tells us this in another place warning us that pastors or evangelist would tell us false truths.

(Jud 1:4) For there are certain men crept in unawares, who were before of old ordained to this condemnation, ungodly men, turning the grace of our God into lasciviousness, and denying the only Lord God, and our Lord Jesus Christ.

My software one is again is in an all out war against me so obviously Satan doesn't want me talking about this. Carefully read Hebrews 10:26-31 and Jude 1:4 because those verses explain themselves very well I feel. We can be forgiven so if you are living in such a sin come as you are repent of your sin and be set free through Christ blood. You can be set free of sin and that is what God wants of all of us. Right now even in my own walk with Christ I need to overcome the sin of anger.

I have to leave you with a question to ponder: When King David sinned with Bathsheba did he say, "well my future sins are covered no need to repent here. Jesus is coming so I will be washed by his blood!" That is not as the Bible records. King Solomon went on to repent next. While God split the kingdom, and Judah (King Solomon's half) became the lesser half, Solomon in his final days went on to pen Ecclesiastes as his letter of repentance. He did this out of fear and reverence because he respected the LORD Jesus Christ and did not want to land in hell for eternity. The Bible also tells us:

(Pro 1:7) The fear of the LORD is the beginning of knowledge: but fools despise wisdom and instruction.

Sin is doing wrong, when God says do what is right and God will tell you. He can do this through fear and it can hit you in your heart as sheer terror as I know from personal experience. This happened to me multiple occasions and I did not have a choice on what to do. Without doing it then and there, whatever it may be, you can lose your soul and go to hell. It is easy to go to hell, in fact many, yes even in church, are heading there right now. A lot of it deals with choices. More often than not it deals with love. The Bible even tells us the following:

(Jas 2:10) For whosoever shall keep the whole law, and yet offend in one point, he is guilty of all.

This is plain and simple. You can't insist on evangelizing without love and with a hammer. God warned me that I would be going to hell, and yes even one night had my preaching not been with love. The warning for me was to learn about the Bible first, but stubbornness and pride got in the past got in my way. Fear tactics, to convert a soul is it often drives that person in the opposite direction. You have to love a person into heaven, but sometimes that is hard too because you can't tell a person all is permissible. Before you hang up on me I speak of forgiveness as what I had to do, in loving my enemies, and in loving God. It is like this whole thing ties together at the end of the page.

(1Sa 15:23) For rebellion is as the sin of witchcraft, and stubbornness is as iniquity and idolatry. Because thou hast rejected the word of the LORD, he hath also rejected thee from being king.

What can sometimes be hard to do is be loving and Christ like. I know I still fail and to be honest with you, I have forgiven everyone. The one part of forgiveness I am suffering in right now is the forgiveness for God just as the man in the movie "The Shack" had a problem with. I hurt!

One thing we can have hope with is that the fact that there is forgiveness at the cross but it is not to be abused.

(1Jn 1:9) If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins, and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness.

(Col 1:13) Who hath delivered us from the power of darkness, and hath translated us into the kingdom of his dear Son:

(Col 1:14) In whom we have redemption through his blood, even the forgiveness of sins:

(Col 3:13) Forbearing one another, and forgiving one another, if any man have a quarrel against any: even as Christ forgave you, so also do ye.

(Rom 6:1) What shall we say then? Shall we continue in sin, that grace may abound?

(Rom 6:2) God forbid. How shall we, that are dead to sin, live any longer therein?

Other verses are about love and forgiveness. While you can't be an atheist and mega-love that doesn't work without Christ. Loving is a great thing. See [1 Corinthians 13 click here!](#)

Other verses on love and sin include the following:

(Pro 10:12) Hatred stirreth up strifes: but love covereth all sins.

(1Pe 4:8) And above all things have fervent charity among yourselves: for charity shall cover the multitude of sins.

The following verse shows that there is no condemnation to them "which are in Christ Jesus." In other words God expects us to walk out our salvation "after the Spirit."

(Rom 8:1) There is therefore now no condemnation to them which are in Christ Jesus, who walk not after the flesh, but after the Spirit.

The condemnation it speaks of is when we are in Christ Jesus not walking after the flesh: When we are after the Spirit we do not face condemnation. We need to understand our actions effect our eternal reward or damnation. Works are in fact important. The following verses speak of this:

(Jas 2:18) Yea, a man may say, Thou hast faith, and I have works: shew me thy faith without thy works, and I will shew thee my faith by my works.

(Jas 2:20) But wilt thou know, O vain man, that faith without works is dead?

(Jas 2:26) For as the body without the spirit is dead, so faith without works is dead also.

Furthermore let us look at the following verse. The two verses before Ephesians 2:10 are almost always used on simple salvation cards trying to prove you don't have to do a thing for God or fellow man.

(Eph 2:10) For we are his workmanship, **created in Christ Jesus unto good works, which God hath before ordained that we should walk in them.**

Bold and underlining my emphasis. While I so often stress works look at the other side of the argument. As a Bible scholar I can't prove a point unless I show both sides of the coin. It is however, your job as a Christian to investigate what I have said by reading the Bible, in another version if you must, to draw your own conclusion; because another verse points out the fact that a pastor is supposed to lead a church but the bottom line is the choice you pick and the road you follow is up to you.

(Gal 6:5) For every man shall bear his own burden.

At the same time the Bible also says:

(Gal 6:2) Bear ye one another's burdens, and so fulfil the law of Christ.

Each man woman and child has their own burden to bear and like it or you may have to get off the couch if you want to go to heaven. (Isa 64:6) But we are all as an unclean thing, and all our righteousnesses are as filthy rags; and we all do fade as a leaf; and our iniquities, like the wind, have taken us away.

Martin Luther after self punishment, he was directed to the following verse. Later he banked on this verse, but in the situation he was going through God knew it was exactly what he needed at the

time. While I am not trying to go back and forth and be wishy washy and dumb down a strong argument; I intend to show both sides of the argument giving you the choice to decide for yourself which side to take.

(Hab 2:4) Behold, his soul *which* is lifted up is not upright in him: but the just shall live by his faith.

Even here in the above verse the soul that is proud, lifted up, is not upright. Whenever you try and argue a point we must be ready to look at the point from different angles as I am doing here.

A lot of churches have members that will go to heaven, but depending on a pastor's doctrine and Bible version, will point people to their own destination before the Great White Throne of Jesus Christ our LORD and Savior. We as ministers of God's Word take the Bible very seriously. We know the Bible's truths and while we can't always be perfect we are working out our salvation as the following verse states:

(Php 2:12) Wherefore, my beloved, as ye have always obeyed, not as in my presence only, but now much more in my absence, work out your own salvation with fear and trembling.
